2019 IUPUI Alumni Interviews: Impacts of IUPUI Experiences on Alumni as Professionals and Contributing Members of Society

Abstract:

The purpose of this project is to learn more about what alumni perceived as meaningful experiences during their time at IUPUI and how those influenced them as both professionals as well as contributing members of society. We are particularly interested in what made the experiences meaningful, their current forms of engagement, and if IUPUI can do anything to improve or increase access to engaged learning opportunities for current students. Results will be useful for understanding how alumni see themselves as "community contributors," one of the four Profiles of Learning for Undergraduate Success.

Purpose of the Project:

The purpose of this project is to better understand how IUPUI prepares students as community contributors, specifically what experiences or interactions with faculty, staff or the community enabled them to explore their areas of interest (social issues) and how those contributed to their levels of engagement after graduation. The information will be useful in identifying high-impact practices that have the greatest outcomes for student learning and sustained engagement.

The timing of this project is an extension of the 2019 Alumni Survey, allowing us to leverage responses regarding student participation in certain types of experiences and levels of learning.

Interviewing alumni enables us to more fully explore the long-term effects of student participation in engaged learning experiences and unpack how the design of student experiences influenced their ways of knowing and who they are as professionals and contributing members of society.

In general, IUPUI has a reputation for community engagement and working in partnership with businesses, nonprofits, schools, and organizations to address their most pressing needs. Students should have multiple opportunities to engage with the community during their time at IUPUI, through curricular, co-curricular, research or experiential experiences. Many of these high-impact practices have

been shown to improve student learning and success and prepare graduates for their careers and as active members of their community. This project will help us better understand what types of experiences, and what about those experiences, are meaningful to our alumni.

Intended Outcomes of the Project:

The Office of Community Engagement has three main priorities in service to the institution and in alignment with the IUPUI Strategic Plan.

We collaborate with communities by:

- Facilitating democratically engaged partnerships with the community, including strategic neighborhood partnerships that address community-identified needs.
- Enhancing understanding of different cultures and promote an inclusive and welcoming campus environment.

We prepare students, faculty, and staff for engagement by:

- Preparing students for lives of engaged citizenship.
- Leading campus efforts to engage with the community in an ethical, strategic, and effective manner
- Fostering the development of community-engaged scholars, practitioners, researchers, and staff.

We tell the story of engagement by:

 Providing information on engagement activities by collecting data and analyzing and translating it for decision making.

The information gathered in this study will help our office achieve these three priorities. Perhaps more importantly, it will result in a more nuanced understanding of alumni responses to the survey which will be used by Institutional Research and Decision Support (IRDS), campus leadership, and faculty to improve best practices that advance student learning and success. Lastly, as IUPUI prepares its Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP) for the Higher Learning Commission, the results of this study can serve

as evidence of improving practices related to the Profiles of Learning for Undergraduate Success, particularly community contributor profile.

Assessment Methods:

The 2019 Alumni Survey (Appendix A) asks respondents to indicate participation (did/didn't) in a variety of high-impact practices (e.g., internships, service as part of a course, service outside of a course, research project with a faculty member). Additionally, respondents are asked:

"How well did IUPUI prepare you to effectively engage in the following skills (not at all prepared, somewhat prepared, quite a bit prepared, very much prepared):

- Write a well-organized final report or paper
- o Prepare a formal oral presentation to communicate ideas and information
- Support an argument using appropriate (quantitative or non-quantitative) data
- o Generate new ideas about how to approach an issue
- Work with people from different backgrounds (e.g. races, ethnicities, religions, socioeconomic backgrounds, cultural, or sexual orientations)
- o Modify how I approach a problem based on the requirements of the situation
- Understand and value cultural differences
- o Initiate interactions with those who are culturally different
- Advocate for my beliefs in a civil and respectful manner
- Contribute to communities locally or globally
- o Recognize my own cultural rules and biases
- Engage in meaningful self-examination and reflection"

If respondents indicate "not at all prepared" or "very much prepared", they will be asked if they are willing to be interviewed. See Appendix B for the semi-structured interview protocol.

Data Analysis:

Alumni interviews will be recorded and transcribed, then coded using NVivo. Reviewers will be looking for types of engaged learning experiences (i.e., high impact practices), why students participated

(or did not participate) in engaged learning experiences, characteristics of best practices (Kuh, 2008), level and type of engagement in social issues since graduation, and recommendations for improvement. The ultimate goal is to understand how and what type of engagement has contributed to them as professionals and contributing members of society.

Evaluation and Dissemination:

Findings will be shared across the IUPUI, including PRAC, and posted in an open access site (ScholarWorks). They will also be referenced in other campus award applications (i.e., Carnegie Classification for Community Engagement in 2025), accreditation reports (i.e., Higher Learning Commission) and disseminated at conferences (e.g., Assessment Institute, CUMU, Indiana Chapter of the Association for Institutional Research, Coalition of Urban and Metropolitan Universities, HIPs in the States).

Budget:

Grant funds will be used to cover the costs of transcribing the interviews and a graduate assistant to assist with the project. The number of alumni interviews is unknown as it is dependent upon how many respondents indicate "not well prepared" and "very well prepared" AND indicate a willingness to be interviewed. Estimated costs using VZP Digital for 75 interviews lasting 30-45min is \$3,750. The remaining funds will be used to hire a graduate assistant to assist with coding and analysis.
